An urgent message from your Secretariat

The Secretariat Summit was held on June 19, 2010. The meeting resulted in some serious and important changes regarding the emphasis on how Cursillo needs to move forward in the future.

### The Tripod!

A significant portion of our annual budget goes toward the printing and mailing of *the tripod*. We have been mailing over 1,000 printed copies of *the tripod* to 1,341 Cursillistas.

For the purposes of redirecting the majority of this expenditure toward Fourth Day programs, we will only distribute *the tripod* electronically (via email) beginning with the Fall issue. For those of you who have received this issue via postal mail, then this will be your **LAST** issue. If you do not have email, and want to continue to receive a printed version of *the tripod* please don't hesitate to contact Barbara Wight (info on p7). Barbara has completed compiling the email addresses we presently have and those members have received this *tripod* by email only. If you are not on our email list and would like to be, please contact Barbara.

Since the Summer 2009 issue of *the tripod*, we have been preparing the membership for this change and it has now been implemented.

### Weekends UPDATE!

In 2011, we have scheduled **one Cursillo Weekend** at this time. This weekend will be available to both men and women and will be held from **March 17, 2011** thru **March 20, 2011** at the Marist House. If we find that we have a waiting list of candidates, we will be pleased to schedule another weekend for later in the year. By limiting our weekends to one, the Secretariat believes that we will be able to focus more of our resources and energies on critical Fourth Day ministries intended to help all Cursillistas in their walk with Christ. It is, of course, never too early to identify candidates and get their applications into the Registrar Donna Tolley at her home address (see p7) at any time of the year. We all should be proactive in nominating people to attend a weekend. Waiting until the last few weeks leading up to a

weekend to identify potential candidates has recently led to the cancellation of the two men's weekends scheduled for 2009 and 2010. Please try and urge our newest members to participate in the numerous Fourth Day activities we have. Among those are **Group Reunions, Ultreyas, Renewal Weekend** (February 11-13, 2011) and the **Day of Deeper Understanding** (October 2, 2010).

# The 4th day 1st

*A message from the Lay Director, Dave Wight*

After all of you have read the "Urgent" news printed on the first page of *the tripod*, you will hopefully understand why my message is about "The Fourth Day First." In this message, I will be using information obtained in the 2nd booklet contained in the National Episcopal Cursillo library, *The Fourth Day First*.

The first experience many of us have had with Cursillo comes during our Three-Day Weekend. For many it is a profoundly joyful experience, but by the third day, we are filled to the brim with rich and varied reactions to the spiritual message of the Weekend.

I am sure that many of us don't remember the talks on Sunday that reflect the how to move into our Fourth Day. The talks on Group Reunion, Ultreya, Spiritual Direction and Christian Community in Action are the basis of that Fourth Day.

The Secretariat has expressed its hope that by changing the emphasis of how we move forward in keeping Cursillo active and growing means we need to all look ahead to our Fourth Day. There are only a few Ultreyas in our Parishes and we would like to see if they can be expanded. Maybe it would be possible for you to organize an Ultreya in your own parish. I attend one each month in my own parish and I get a lot out of being with my brothers and sisters. It is also

noteworthy to know that Ultreyas are open to those who have not yet attended their own weekend. Singing, sharing and a message, along with the Eucharist is not just for Cursillistas. Once an individual attends their own weekend then with the help of their sponsors, they should be excited by participating in Group Reunions. They should also be urged by any and all of their brothers and sisters to attend Ultreyas, Renewal Weekends and the Annual Day of Deeper Understanding.

A former Lay Director, Regina Gurney, reminded me a while back in one of her messages that we should "Remember to attend Ultreyas. This is where you'll enjoy the company of all your brothers and sisters in Christ. You will share in their struggles and triumphs in calling others to Christ. And lastly, remember what we learned on our weekends—that is to transform our environment and bring the world to Christ."

# grace and faith

A message from the Treasurer, Malcolm Gurney

The following is taken from a Lenten Folder called *Grace and Faith*.

*Time to step up and stay focused. "Take It Away." The season of Lent, apart from the Easter Joy that marks its conclusion, is one that contains some unpleasant memories. We remember a triumphal entry into Jerusalem, but it is soon followed by the supper, where a close friend and follower was revealed to be a traitor. Later Jesus is found weeping in a garden. Betrayal gives way to arrest by the Romans. One disciple denies even knowing Jesus. Others desert him.*

*"Take them away." Why should we recall such dismal, troubling times? Perhaps, though, we can learn from them. Before Judas betrayed Jesus, he betrayed himself. He failed to trust and rely upon the wisdom of one whom he had followed with high expectations and dedication. He betrayed his own hope. Do we today lose out on some of what life has to offer, because we fail to trust fully the validity of God's plan? We may wonder at times if sincerity and belief really pay off in the long plan. We may begin to compromise our ideals and become less than our best. How can we avoid this possibility?*

*The answer comes, "By Grace you are saved through Faith". Grace and Faith work within us in several ways. Grace lets us know that even if we have these doubts and thoughts of betrayal God still loves us. God realizes that we have human weaknesses and helps us to overcome them. As a kind parent, God lifts us when we fall and enables us to start over. Faith helps us through the indwelling pres-*

*ence of Christ, who persevered to the end. Jesus died but then rose again. Steadfastness in ways of love and peace will ultimately win out. God will give us the victory. And what is our gratitude for all this? We can live in a way that reflects Christ Spirit.*

**Reflection and thoughts:** I have come to realize that Cursillo as we have known it has changed. For what reason I do not know but I feel our community needs to step up and help to revitalize Cursillo or we will face perhaps betraying the commitment we made to Christ on our weekends. Two years in a row our Men's Weekends have been cancelled due to lack of candidates. On the last Coed Weekend, I was service team captain and was very disappointed with the response from the community in regard to the small amount of Palanca received, and the poor attendance at Sunday's La Mananitas where there was a total absence of flowers. Two people even went outside and hand picked wild flowers. Also, if you remember two years ago, our Renewal Weekend was also cancelled due to the commitment to fill the team. At our 2010 Annual Meeting, Erik Forsberg gave a very excellent overview of our current situation. This included some of the problems that exist and some of the change that may be needed to revitalize our community.

The Secretariat Summit Meeting was held June 19th and many of these issues were discussed. Some of these changes are listed in this issue of *the tripod*. The Renewal Weekend is scheduled for February 11-13, 2011. Let's finish 2010 with a renewed effort from the community to revitalize the *Christ-centered Cursillo* experience that we once did. 2011 will bring a new schedule for weekends, so start now to pray about candidates to bring to Cursillo. Pray about your commitment, don't let Jesus down, remember *He is counting on you*.

To quote from an email I received from Dave Wight about activities in a Northeast Regional Meeting in Islip, NY May 2010 "If we stay focused on our mission and the primary goals of the movement, we will be most effective in our mission."

Don't forget to continue to send in your pledges for 2010. Have a great summer, see you in the fall.

## Servant Community Highlights 2009-2010

---

The Servant Community/Reunion met at Trinity Church, Canton on September 12, 2009 and on February 6, 2010. We meet twice a year to discuss and share how our individual involvements on Weekends and 4th day activities are progressing as well as to address any and all concerns the Secretariat may have for us to carry out. These gatherings last about 2-1/2 hours at which time we share a Group Reunion, a short teaching or meditation, share our ideas and concerns and, of course, enjoy "goodies" that members bring to share.

Our hope is that new Cursillistas will come on board and become active participants in MEC's Servant Community. We meet at Trinity in Canton (which seems to be a central location within the Diocese) usually the first Saturday mornings of February and September, although information is always printed in *the tripod*.

At our meetings this past year we discussed and/or acted upon the following:

- We are still looking into the possibility of conducting a Spanish-speaking Weekend—however the Secretariat has run into difficulties and timing concerns that have slowed down the progress. That is not to say that it will not happen. As with everything we need suggestions and helpful ideas along with committed leadership.
- It was decided that Palanca Room Greeters would most likely be spouses, and prayer partners of Team and Candidates. Marsha Corliss has drawn up some helpful rules on what to do and what not to do in the Palanca Room. The cost of a weekend for the Rollo Team and Service Team is presently \$160.00.
- The 3rd Day of Deeper Understanding (DDU) was held at All Saints, Whitman on October 3, 2009 with 40 attendees. It was led by Regina Gurney and her Team. The DDU's have turned out to be a very worthwhile 4th Day Offering, bringing new and old Cursillistas together to share their mutual love for the Movement and each other while learning more about our 4th Days and what Christ may have in store for us. Our 4th DDU will be held at St. Mark's in Southborough on Saturday, October 2, 2010.
- There is continuing discussion and discernment concerning the distribution of *the tripod* by Email instead of postal snailmail to reduce expenses. Presently each *tripod* costs about \$300 for printing and \$400 for postage. (The number of *tripods* distributed for each issue is 1044 at this time. Dick Wright presented a summary showing that the New England total is 979 with 65 outside New England. The breakdown is MA-910, RI-25, NH-23, ME-11, CT-8 and VT-2. We have only 394 Email addresses at this time which would mean that many would not receive a *tripod* if the only distribution was electronic.
- Erik Forsberg has formulated a Musician Spreadsheet to be used to contact those who would be willing to play a musical instrument at Sponsor's Liturgies, Mananitas and Closings.
- Notification has been received from the National Episcopal Cursillo that since the Lutheran Church is now in Communion with the Episcopal Church, they are considered to be part of the Episcopal Cursillo and are encouraged to take part in our weekends and 4th day activities.
- The Speaker's Bureau has successfully visited three area churches over the past year to talk to their parishioners about Cursillo. Elgin Summerfelt and his Team has felt positive about the reception they received, and are hoping that more of our Servant Community will be encouraged to take part in this outreach ministry.
- The Sponsor's Liturgy that is held on Thursday of each weekend in the Chapel has been faithfully led by Bill Webb. He appreciates volunteers to witness, read scripture, and play music in order to ensure that this service is a true gift of Palanca for the Team and Candidates.

## editor's corner

On the wings of a prayer this week came "my closest moment to Christ" when I was asked one Friday to do the witness talk at the upcoming Ultreya. Although I have done many witnesses, it is always a challenge for me to get up in front of people. God knows it is definitely taking me out of my comfort zone, and I need to pray especially hard for His direction. Here is what happened.

My first reaction was NO. "Are you kidding me?" I can't do this, I am concentrating on trying to find a job. I can't even think, let alone write a witness talk. Then, as I normally do, I sent up a prayer for God to rain down His guidance and wisdom. I prayed, and prayed, and then prayed again. It felt like all I got were those emotions from what I call Satan's workshop—*anxiety, fear, insecurity, confusion, just to name a few.*

I prayed all weekend, but only silence. I "Googled" *Persevere* (the theme) to see if that would help.

*Persevere—to persist in anything undertaken; to maintain a purpose in spite of difficulty, obstacles, or discouragement; to continue steadfastly.*

Well, I have persevered for worldly things: to save for a vaca-

tion, or to buy something I really wanted but those are material things. I don't think I God wants me to witness on that. So again I prayed, and prayed and prayed.

As we all know, *all things happen in His time* and God's time just happened to be Monday. I'm getting pretty discouraged with job searching and I threw up my hands and said, "OK, I'm going to the beach". Is there an occupation which involves walking the beach and sunbathing? I packed up some snacks and off I went.

Because I like to spend quiet time with God, my radio is always off when I drive (unless I'm listening to Christian radio/CD). OK, now I am by myself in the car talking out loud.

"OK GOD, the theme for the Ultreya is "perseverance." How can I concentrate on writing a talk. I can't even concentrate on this conversation with YOU. OK, "I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me." What would Jesus do? He always persevered and didn't complain. The more I focused on Jesus, the more these words came: Love, healing, joy, humble, celebrate, betrayed, distraught, beaten, agony, cross, nails, death, resurrection, He is Alive. I love YOU. I did this for YOU because I love YOU."

I LOVE YOU!! Smack! It hit me, that 2x4 again.

"Marsha, what do you persevere in?" just flew out of my mouth. Then with what sounded like thunder, I heard.

"Marsha, you have persevered in prayer about your job search and all weekend about this witness. You are persevering in your job search now and have been since January. You CAN do this, you have persevered always in everything you have undertaken for ME and MY glory."

Now the tears are flowing and the hairs on my arms are standing on end. All I could do was smile, take a deep breath and say "Thank you Jesus, thank you. You totally ROCK my world." No pun intended.

So it appears, the witness God wanted me to present was my perseverance in prayer.

All week I have been singing this song "Orphans of God" which is sung by Avalon heres an excerpt.
