The weekend is open to anybody who has made Cursillo. This includes, Catholic Cursillo, Walk to Emmaus, Tres Dias, and Fourth Day. The name on the door is not important. It's the name on your heart that matters. So, let's focus on Jesus; without Him we are nothing.

# God opens new doors!

from the lay director of the secretariat

We have all heard the words that God does not close one door without opening another! Well, the Secretariat has been involved in many new and important changes in the Cursillo movement in Massachusetts in the past few months. In our work to serve Christ, we have tried to look at ways to strengthen Cursillo. We all stood at one time at the altar and received our cross with the words spoken to us "Jesus is counting on you" and our response was "And I on Him!" With these words in our hearts, we need to look to the future without necessarily looking at how we got where the Cursillo movement is today.

It is always exciting to think back to the days when we attracted more than 200 new candidates during one year with as many as seven weekends. And now we have just finished the last two years with only 22 candidates in 2009 on two weekends and then 9 candidates in 2010 also on two weekends. Things needed to change. While it appears that doors are closing, it is important to know that God will open new doors for us to go through in our walk with Christ.

The Secretariat has made some decisions that are not necessarily popular with some of our members. We studied many alternatives, and we spent countless hours to do what we thought would best serve the Cursillo movement in Massachusetts in the immediate future. We heard many brothers who dedicated themselves on two occasions to prepare for a men's weekend only to be disappointed on both occasions because the community failed to provide the candidates for them to teach. We ALL bear the responsibility for the cancellation of those weekends. One particular member of those two teams spoke personally to me and asked me why we didn't have a list of candidates before the team started their work. I really did not have a good answer to that question. The main reason for not being able to

tell him why is because as long as I have been involved the community always came through. We can no longer assume that what happened for years is going to continue. So, with that said, the Secretariat made some decisions that we hope will strengthen our programs for the future.

In 2011 we have only scheduled one Cursillo weekend. We have continuously asked our members to send in applications at ANY TIME so that we can have them on file. To date we have not received any and we hope that will change soon. It is important for me to mention at this point that we have only "scheduled" one weekend. If the community sends in more applications we can and will schedule as many weekends as needed. We have placed this responsibility in all of our hands!

We are trying to help Him open new doors. Our **Tripod** is now being sent by email only. We are hoping that any member who gets it by email will be kind enough to print a copy for those brothers and sisters near them who do not have email and would like a printed copy. By changing our method of notifying members of news we will save more than \$2,800.00 in printing and postage. In the last printed and snail mailed **Tripod**, we notified our members that at our Summit "the meeting resulted in some serious and important changes regarding the emphasis on how Cursillo needs to move in the future."

In my message to you in that same **Tripod**, I spoke of "the 4th day first." We are now focusing on more Fourth Day activities, and you will find them in the report from the Secretariat also in this edition of the **Tripod**.

While we are sad about this situation, it is important to remember what our Assistant Lay Director said to me: "The Marist House is NOT Cursillo!" WE are Cursillo and we WILL find another facility."

The Lay Director has appointed Karla Semeter, as the "Retreat Center Coordinator." She will be receiving any suggestions for Retreat Centers that might be available. ## excerpts from the **Servant community/** **reunion meeting – Feb. 5, 2011**

**B**inki opened the meeting at 10:00 AM. Bill Webb read a Luke 12 passage from “Day by Day”.

A teaching had been planned by Dave Quinones who was unable to attend the meeting. . . . Jack Foster gave a teaching based on the Servant Community booklet in the MEC Library. . . .

We welcomed a newcomer, Leslie Perron, who has been acting as the MEC Representative to the Church of the Good Shepherd in Wareham.

Dave Wight reported that Erik Forsberg now has a CD from the National Episcopal Cursillo containing all the booklets in the NEC Library. They are able to be copied and distributed without special copyright restrictions. An updated version will be made available each year.

Group Reunion was shared by all reporting their Piety–Study–or Action.

Dave Wight reported for Dave Quinones about the upcoming meeting of the MEC and Bishop Shaw. It is scheduled for 7:00 PM Tuesday, May 10th at St. Mark’s Church in Southborough. This was the earliest time that Bishop Shaw could meet with us. The purpose of this meeting is to have as many Cursillistas as possible convey to the Bishop what Cursillo has meant to them, not to question the Bishop about his support for the MEC. This meeting will be preceded by a pot luck supper.

Dave then continued with some of the important subjects of the recent Secretariat meeting which included:

1. Donna Tolley will be taking over as Cursillo Centers Coordinator in place of Elgin Summerfelt.

2. The Marist House is closing permanently June 30th! All the banners will be removed from the cellar of the Marist House and brought to the meeting with Bishop Shaw to be picked up by the Rector/a’s of their corresponding weekends or to someone else who will take responsibility for them. The Secretariat is studying new locations for us to have weekends. The cabinets of all the weekend materials will be stored somewhere else at a place to be determined.
3. Chad Wohler is relinquishing his task as Webmaster to Allison and Mahir Akarsu.
4. Inputs for the next **Tripod** should be received by Marsha Corliss by February 7th for an electronic mailing about February 15th.
5. The Secretariat had decided to change the date of the Annual Meeting/Diocesan Ultreya to April 23rd. It was pointed out that this was unacceptable because it is the Saturday after Good Friday prior to Easter. The previous Tripod had said that plans were being made for it to be held on May 15th (Sunday) which was probably meant to be Saturday, May 14th. It was scheduled to be held at Church of the Good Shepherd in Wareham. The Secretariat will review this and have it publicized in the next **Tripod**.
6. Karla Semeter is coordinator for finding a new location for weekends.
7. The date and location for the Day of Deeper Understanding have not been decided yet.
8. The Renewal Weekend is planned for March 18–20th at the Marist House with Bill and Pam Taylor putting on a concert Saturday evening. Details will be in the next **Tripod**.

Ellen Harland passed along a comment about Service Team selection. There has been difficulty getting volunteers because of the expense (\$160.00) to participate. She suggested having them go at no charge since they do so much work on a weekend.

There was some discussion about the snailmailing of the **Tripods** to those who request it. Donna Tolley volunteered to mail **Tripods** out to those who request them. Requests should be sent to Barbara Wight or to Donna Tolley. . . .

## from the archives

When we think about the church's purpose in the world, many things can come to mind. We think about good works the church is about, we think about the witness to Jesus we are bound to make, and perhaps we think of how the church functions as a place we can grow spiritually. All of the above are important aspects of the church's mission, but I think the most fundamental purpose of the church is to be a community of prayer.

Prayer is the glue that holds us together, and the means by which we

catch the vision of everything else we do as Christians. Our liturgy each Sunday is nothing more than a series of prayers which are always answered by Christ with the gift of His Son's Body and Blood.

With all that in mind, it strikes me that Lent is a particularly good time to take stock of our prayer lives: both the corporate prayer we offer together in church, and the private prayer life we experience in other places.

How's your prayer life these days? Is it something that is a part of every day for you? Is it something you make time for, or only when you happen to think about it? Of what do your prayers consist?

I have two unsolicited pieces of advice for you: First, make time this Lent for prayer. Second, spend as much time **listening** in your prayers as you do **asking** God for something.

Time for God is never as meaningful when we have it hit or miss. Find a time that's right for you and make it part of your daily discipline, like brushing your teeth! Take only five minutes to start, but spend that time alone and in quiet each day. Find a special place in your home to have this time, and see that you are in a comfortable posture as you pray (not too comfortable, though, lying down may produce an unplanned nap!).

Once you've got that time and place, spend at least half of it just listening. Yes, God wants to hear your concerns and petitions, but God also wants you to hear Him as well! Open your mind and your heart, and God will speak in some way to you. Maybe it will be an answer you have been searching for, or, more likely, it will be a sense of being loved by God which will more than arm you for the day to come.

Soon, if you follow this regimen, you will find that 5 minutes is not enough, and that you need to spend more time in prayer. You will also find that this is not some onerous task, but something to which you look forward each day. Give it a try; I'll be glad to hear how you are doing!
