# Our Treasury in the Red?

A message from the Treasurer, Malcolm Gurney

**D**ear Brothers and Sisters in Christ: The Massachusetts Episcopal Cursillo is in serious need of your financial help. Summer has passed and during that time we saw little to no financial activity. As we approach the remainder of this year, the treasury balance is only \$3,008.06. This may seem like a significant amount of money, but expenses from the upcoming Co-ed Weekend in November is just around the corner. The expenses from this, and the remaining expected expenses which are: one more **Tripod** printing and mailing to this 2009 year, the P.O. Box Fee, the Day of Deeper Understanding expenses, the National Dues and like I said before general weekend expenses it would require approximately \$3,800.00 to \$4,000.00 (depending on the number of candidates for the co-ed weekend). This will leave the

treasury balance around \$1,000.00 in the red.

The Secretariat is praying that we can survive this problem for the remaining of this year. We, as the secretariat, are addressing this financial problem by:

1) Looking into changing the policy of a complete free weekend and possibly having Candidates perhaps pay a portion of the weekend.

2) Attempting to devise a plan by which **The Tripod** will be emailed to those who choose it and reducing our cost of printing and mailing the quarterly newsletter.

Remembering the mountain top experience that your weekend provided for you, the Secretariat is appealing to you for your prayers and financial support at this time. Since the first year of the Pledge program, income from pledges has decreased. The first year (2005) we received \$9,340.00, in 2009 we

have to date received \$4,528.00. The total decline is \$4,812.00.

The Secretariat and myself as treasurer are extremely grateful for all your past support. We also recognize that this is a hard time for a lot of you, however may we appeal to you for a donation of any amount you can give which will be very much appreciated. Perhaps a few of you could get together and have a yard sale to benefit MEC or run a supper at your church. We wish you all Peace and Happiness and may the Lord continue to shine on you.

# The Editor's Corner

**M**y study, beside my daily devotional and daily Bible readings is a book called: "Me and My Big Mouth" by Joyce Meyer. If you haven't read anything by Joyce Meyer get ready for some "hit you between the eyes, non-sugar coated" reading. She is pretty intense.

It's an older book copyrighted 1997. But I liked the title and thought OK my mouth has gotten me into trouble before saying something I wish I hadn't. Even though it was jokingly, the words can still hurt people's feelings.

Basically this book is about training yourself to be a positive person, having a positive attitude no matter what the circumstances.

Are we doing God's work by speaking with love, gentleness, kindness, building people up and keeping a positive attitude.

Or are we doing Satan's work by arguing, complaining, being sarcastic and having a negative attitude.

How about an example? Do you go into a crowded restaurant and say: "I will never get seated" or "OK, it is only a 45 minute wait?" Even a small negative thing like that is giving Satan a foothold into your thoughts and life.

by what just a few say or how they act. It got me thinking about Philippians and one of the first scriptures I learned by heart.
