Vegetables:

Asparagus (perennial):

- Millenium, \$10 for six-plant flat Cabbage (all green):
- Farao: early, not for winter storage
- Passat: winter storage
- Reaction: winter storage

Celery:

- Tango: Short season, does well here Cucumber:
- Little Leaf: pickling, fresh eating
- Marketmore standard slicer

Peppers:

- New Ace: Standard green bell pepper
- King Crimson: Red bell pepper
- Early Jalapeno: Hot
- Long Red Narrow Cayenne: Hot, often dried

Tomatoes:

- Brandywine: traditional heirloom beefsteak
- Cherokee Carbon: beefsteak, cross of two heirlooms
- Cosmonaut Volkov: superior tasting Ukranian heirloom, grows well here
- Damsel: disease-resistant heirloom-like beefsteak
- Glacier: "saladette", very early
- Juliet: disease-resistant cherry
- Matt's Wild Cherry: prolific tiny delicious tomatoes
- Mountain Magic: "saladette", blightresistant
- San Marzano: classic Italian paste
- Sun Gold: yellow cherry
- Jet Star: reliable medium-size
- Tasti Lee: prolific, mid-size, superior flavor

Winter squash & pumpkins (all for eating)

- Burpee Butterbush: bush butternut squash
- Little Dipper: small butternut squash
- Long Pie: looks like an overgrown zucchini, but makes the best pumpkin pies
- Sweet REBA: acorn squash
- Winter Luxury pumpkin: great for pies

Herbs:

Basil: standard Italian

Catnip: For your cat!

Chamomile: flowers used for tea; annual but

self-seeds

Lemon balm: pollinator-friendly perennial,

adds lemon flavor

Oregano:: standard Greek, perennial

Parsley, Krausa: Deeply curled

Stinging Nettle: Said to help allergies, also

good as cooked green, perennial
